



### Licensing Rules Issue 4.0

1. All members may personally introduce friends as their guests but no person who is eligible for membership shall be introduced more than once in any calendar week and no member may introduce more than two friends at any one time. The foregoing provisions of this rule shall not apply to the introduction by any member of his/her partner, admission of who shall be subject to such regulations as may from time to time be made by the Bar Committee. The following shall not be admitted as visitors.
  - (a) Former members who have been expelled.
  - (b) Persons who having been candidates for membership, but have been refused membership.Members shall be responsible for the good behaviour of guests introduced by them during the period of their stay in the Club.
2. There may be admitted to the Clubs registered premises persons other than members or their guests belonging to any of the classes specified in this rule and intoxicating liquor may be sold to such persons by or on behalf of the Club for consumption on the premises and not elsewhere. The classes of non-members who may be so admitted are as follows.
  - (a) Any member/ supporter/ official of any visiting sporting team at a bona fide fixture.
  - (b) Any person belonging or elected to an organisation attending a bona fide meeting at the Club's registered premises.
  - (c) Any relative of a member who is on holiday/visiting/temporarily staying with a member or a member's family for a period not exceeding 21 days and nights.
  - (d) Persons attending special functions in the Clubs registered premises each function taking place with the Committee's prior approval and are directly connected to a member or member's family.
  - (e) On no more than 12 special occasions during the twelve month period in addition to (a)- (d) above, the Club may sell intoxicating liquor for such special occasions as:-
    - i. Open days, whereby the Club is open to the local community.
    - ii. Parties and any other special function not covered above.
3. Intoxicating liquor may only be sold for consumption at the Club site.
4. There is a period of 48 hours between a member being accepted for membership and admitted to the privileges of the Club.
5. Club License hours are 10-00 am to 22-30 pm any day.
6. The upholding of these rules and amendments is delegated to the Designated Premises Supervisor with the support of the Bar Committee - members appointed by the Management Committee.
